

" Winchelsea the awards edition!

I write this as everyone at Winchelsea is having a welcome Autumn half term break after a super half term start to our new academic year. The children have been fantastic and it has been wonderful to see them back in school after the summer break, enjoying their learning, loving being with their friends and having fun in their lessons. We have welcomed lots of new children and families to our popular school, not only in our Reception and Nursery class but across the whole school. A number of our classes are now full and all of our Key Stage 2 classes have exceeded the planned numbers so we are full to the brim!

PGL adventures



At the end of September 36 children and 4 adults went to PGL in Devon for a week of adventures. This was a fantastic week. We rose to the challenges of abseiling, archery, rifle shooting, zip wire, giant swing and so much more. New activities for us at this venue were giant paddle-boarding and the dry ski slope and it was great to expand our experiences. The children were super and we received huge com-

pliments from all the staff we encountered at PGL as well as members of the public we came across on our travels. You can see some of our adventures on Twitter!

This month I thought I would share some information about all the awards that Winchelsea has been proud to gain in recent months which recognise the great work we are doing.

Sport at Winchelsea

It has been great to get our clubs up and running again for the new academic year and we know that the children really enjoy the opportunities to develop their interests and skills beyond the normal school day. We have lots of sports clubs for all ages and we have shown our commitment to valuing sport to a high standard in our provision. Last year our netball and football teams won both of their leagues and we had great successes in many of the competitions we entered against other local schools. Sport at



Winchelsea continues to go from strength to strength and we continue to provide opportunities and experiences for children to encounter a range of different sports through Friday festivals organised through our links with Carre's – some of them quite unusual.



We aim to ensure that all children get a chance throughout the school year to take part in at least one inter-school event and it is this commitment that has helped to secure the highest level of Platinum School Games award which can only be gained by maintaining the gold level for over five years. Our children always try their hardest in all the sports fixtures they attend and I am proud of their excellent team spirit and sporting values. More evidence of Winchelsea teamwork at its very best!

Cycle September

In September Winchelsea signed up for the 'Cycle September' challenge for the second year running which was taking place not only across Lincolnshire but across the whole country. Mrs Durnin, Mr Green and myself (with some help from our family and friends) took up the challenge to ride our bikes as much as possible and every cycling journey was individually logged – both for leisure and for cycling to and from work. We were very proud to receive this certificate which showed that we had achieved first place in Lincolnshire for our efforts (an improvement on last year when we came third!).

International Schools Award

Over the last eight years we have developed lots of work with schools in other countries and introduced lots of activities in school that enable our children to understand and appreciate

what life is like for children in different parts of our own country and around the world. We have organised some great activity days in school such as a European Day when the children learnt all about the features of other countries such as traditional songs and dances, researched the country flags, geographical aspects (rivers, mountains), famous people born there, currency and flags and super displays were created around school. We have also made links with schools in other countries and regularly communicate with them – the children love sending videos and writing and receiving letters or emails and we have learnt some phrases in



Turkish, Spanish, German, French and Ukrainian. Since we welcomed two Ukrainian sponsored pupils we have also been able to empathise with the problems they are facing and it has been fantastic to see how well the two of them have flourished, how fluently they can now speak English and how welcoming and supportive the Winchelsea pupils have been. This is now the second time that we have been given this award and we will shortly be visiting Westminster to receive this accolade at a very prestigious event — may have to get a posh frock!

Caring2Learn Gold award



Caring2Learn is a project that seeks to recognise the work that schools do in supporting vulnerable children and young people. Winchelsea school has been recognised for the great work that we do with the community and with families to enable all of our pupils to become confident and to achieve better than expected progress academically. We completed a

very detailed portfolio of evidence and were visited by leaders in education who assessed our work. I am very proud that we received the highest accolade possible by gaining a gold award for our work in this area. I am in my fifth year working as a Caring2Learn Education Champion. This work involves me visiting other schools within the county to support them in developing their provision. I enjoy the opportunities this provides me with to learn about new practices to improve our provision at Winchelsea but also the new ideas I gain from seeing the work of other schools.

As always, I would like to make sure that I have said a great big thank you to all linked with our school who have supported us in so many ways — I consider Winchelsea to be one big team consisting of staff, children, governors, parents and the wider community and we all work together to make Winchelsea the great school that it is.

We are, naturally, very proud of our school and know it stems from the great team work that we have at Winchelsea – staff, pupils, parents, governors and the community are all valuable to the success of our school. We have been oversubscribed for five consecutive years now and five of our seven classes are full, with waiting lists in place so if you know of friends who are intending to register their children at Winchelsea in the future or you have little ones of your own it may be advisable to talk to us soon! I believe that if you visit Winchelsea School you will be impressed by the friendly atmosphere and caring nature of all who work here but also by the pupils' enthusiasm for learning that makes our school special. Local Defibrillators



Ruskington has public access defibrillators at the following locations:

- * The Winchelsea Centre, 11 High Street
 North, NG34 9DY
- * The Co-op, High Street North, NG34 9DY
- * The Village Hall , Parkfield Road, NG34 9HT
- Ruskington Medical Centre, 6 Brookside
 Close, NG34 9GQ

These are free to use by the members of the public. Upon calling the emergency services, they will be able to instruct you on where to go and how to access the defibrillator, if needed. But its always good to have a mental note of where the nearest one is located.

If there is any concerns in relation to the defibrillators, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council on 01526 834483.

Hospital Voluntary Car Service (HVCS)

The service provides a reliable door-to-door journey and is available to all residents of Ruskington and Dorrington who have no other viable or practical means of attending a medical or dental appointment.

It is available for journeys to locations within the county although this can be extended to Nottinghamshire, Cambridgeshire and Derbyshire if required. It is charged at 45p per mile (Measured from the centre of Ruskington.)

If you have a car and a few hours to spare why not become a volunteer driver. You are paid 45p per mile – tax free!

Note: The HVCS has been approved to operate during the current COVID pandemic with some restrictions on number of patients carried.
