Dog Off-Lead Area

Ruskington Parish Council is exploring the possibility of creating an area on the far (north) field at Parkfield playing fields for dogs to be exercised off-lead. The football pitches (space for 2 pitches) and trees will not be affected. (Please see the map below).

The area will be securely fenced, and dog waste / litter bins will be provided and emptied.

This is being considered following ongoing concerns of dog fouling on the football pitches, and reports of dogs off-lead running up to children, adults and other dogs using the playing fields.

Before this area can go ahead, the Council needs to know your views on a dog off-lead exercise area. Therefore, it would be appreciated if you could answer the questions by scanning the QR code or collecting a paper survey from the office.

Winchelsea the end of another unusual year!

Last time I wrote my article for the Signpost magazine we were beginning to return to a more familiar school life with all children back in school after lockdown. It has been so fantastic to have all of the children back in school as well as lots of new ones who have joined us after moving into the locality. The buzz and excitement of school life has returned and we have enjoyed being together again. Of course, we have still had lots of restrictions in place and continued to adapt our daily practice to be mindful of Covid safety but we were so pleased to be able to see each other and get back to doing what we enjoy most — learning and making progress in a fun and exciting environment!



We had a great afternoon in the last week of the academic year which was the culmination of a whole term's work around learning about wedding traditions as part of the RE curriculum. Emerald class are Year 4 (8 and 9 year olds) and they have been learning all about a Christian wedding ceremony and all the traditions that are part of the day. Winchelsea has developed a crea-

tive curriculum and we think the best way to learn whenever possible is through an immersive, experiential method and so as the children learnt they began to put together all the

elements needed for an actual wedding day. Every child in the class had an allotted role – bride and groom and extended wedding party of best man, bridesmaids and parents etc but also the vicar, ushers and even a photographer – I am just hoping that the photos taken by the child responsible for this role do not have all the heads chopped off! Parents were invited to the outdoor wedding ceremony (socially distanced of course) and after the vows had been shared there was a super wedding reception on the school field. Here more children took up the roles of waiting staff who served the buffet food and others were responsible for the music, acting as DJs! The speeches were all written by the children – the best man



told stories of meeting the groom in nursery and the groom wrote a very affectionate speech about his bride! The first dance was 'Superman' by request and the audience joined in with 'Cha Cha Slide!'. Even the headteacher was roped on (that's me) as I was the chauffeur who delivered the bride and her 'father' in my car with the roof down! It was a wonderful occasion and brought a smile to everyone's faces. It was a lot of work and the staff and children did a great job and the parents were as supportive as ever — a real community event.



We love sport at Winchelsea and it has been a shame that the children have missed out on so many of the usual sporting activities this year. However, as soon as we were able to we began to take part in school competitions or festivals that give the oppor-

tunity for the children to try out different sports or improve their skills in a competitive environment. The photo shows our Year 6 cricket team who played very

well at their event held at Sleaford Cricket club. We managed to hold sports days in our bubbles and invite parents to join us — seven different sports days! What a feat! It was lovely to see parents enjoying these events again and the parents' races were of a very high standard and very competitive!



We have also been able to organise some school trips beyond the school environment which has been very exciting. Our youngest children in our nursery and Reception class had two fantastic trips — one to Tattershall Farm Park and the other to Belton House where they enjoyed the adventure playground and had a picnic with their parents in the extensive grounds.

We were extremely pleased that we were able to take some of our Year 5 and 6 pupils on a residential activity week on the Isle of Wight! This was due to take place in September 2020 but was continually postponed throughout the year until we received the great news that PGL centres could open up again so we managed to get away at the start of July. This is a fantastic week for the children, providing them not only with the challenge of being away from their families and a familiar bed but also some activities that really push

them out of their comfort zone. Some activities require some climbing to a considerable height, some activities took place on the water such as kayaking and dragon boating and other tasks involved problem solving and team work such as orienteering and survival skills requiring shelter building and fire starting! It was a great week and we even managed to watch the England football semi-final outside our log cabins! These are the Winchelsea memories that we hope children will treasure.

The Ruskington Churchyard Wildflower Project

Ruskington Parish Churchyard can become a sanctuary for the living as well as the long dead, with an abundance and diversity of indigenous and localised plants and wildlife.

This year, with the blessing of the Church and in keeping with Parish Council and County and District Environmental Policies, we are proposing to explore ways to manage our Churchyard that are sympathetic to the natural habitat and ecology of native plants and animals, especially pollinators.

This can be achieved by designating some areas which are to be mown less frequently in order to allow wild flowers and grasses to grow and set seed, whilst other areas remain closely mown to facilitate access.

When defining these areas it is important to bear in mind that a Churchyard should be:

- A pleasant and reflective area for congregation and visitors;
- A fit and proper setting for a church;
- An environment in keeping with the purpose of the Churchyard, with an atmosphere of respect and commemoration for those interred there over 140 years ago;
- A haven for grasses, wild flowers, trees, birds, butterflies and other wild species;
- A source of inspiration and information for residents and visitors alike.

A survey of species present is to be carried out in order to design an optimum mowing and management plan. However, a Conservation Officer from Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust has already identified 7 or 8 species which are indicative of the potential of the Churchyard for "re-wilding" and turning into a wildlife meadow.

RPC has already appointed a Caretaker for Grounds and Maintenance who takes up his position on 15 July 2021. To begin with the designated area will be left uncut for one season to establish what plants are there and to allow them to bloom and set seed.

First cut will take place in August and the cuttings removed. There will be a further cut at the end of October, again with removal of cuttings. This removal is important to reduce the fertility of the soil and encourage a greater diversity of wild plants.

Subsequently seeds such as Yellow Rattle, collected from another wildflower may be sown into the church meadow, to establish itself and so reduce the most vigorous grasses allowing other wildflowers to flourish.

With our careful and sympathetic management in the next two years or so we fully expect our Churchyard to turn into an area of tranquillity, beauty and peace that will grace the heart of our village.

Ruskington has public access defibrillators at the following locations:

These are free to use by the members of the public. Upon calling the emergency services, they will be able to instruct you on where to go and how to access the defibrillator, if needed. But its always good to have a mental note of where the nearest one is located.

Hospital Voluntary Car Service (HVCS)

The service provides a reliable door-to-door journey and is available to all residents of Ruskington and Dorrington who have no other viable or practical means of attending a medical or dental appointment.

It is available for journeys to locations within the county although this can be extended to Nottinghamshire, Cambridgeshire and Derbyshire if required. It is charged at 45p per mile (Measured from the centre of Ruskington.)
