After all, she did us no favours in late Autumn and Winter when our village was severely flooded causing great disruption, personal hardship and grief to many.

If it's possible to take any 'positives' from the floods, they did bring out the very best in people with many joining us on 20 October to fill and distribute sandbags or to simply check on the welfare of those worst affected by the rapidly rising waters. But the floods have also forced us to ask ourselves how we could be better prepared. Certainly, as a Parish Council we have reinforced the village local Emergency Plans plus the Environment Agency and Lincolnshire County Council are working hard to identify 'higher-level' and sustainable solutions. But any future flood



mitigation must include a large helping of self preparation by those of us likely to be affected by these increasingly frequent events so I urge you all to familiarise yourselves with the flood information included on our Website.

So, looking ahead. Unfortunately, this will be the final edition of the Signpost Magazine because, without sponsorship, it simply isn't viable. We will, however, publish timely and relevant information through our various communication platforms, including a 'slimmed-down' information leaflet which will be available in the RPC office, the Library, Pubs and shops etc. In the meantime, we will continue to consult with you to find out your long-term aspirations for our village services and amenities, so why not have a chat with us at the Annual Parish Meeting on 12 March 2024 or RPC Info Hub at this year's Family Funday on 29 June 2024.

RUSKINGTON **CEMETERY NEWS**

A Peaceful Resting Place for Loved Ones

At Ruskington Parish Council, we're • delighted to offer a dedicated ashes scattering area, providing a serene option for laying your loved ones to rest within our community. We understand importance of choice during this sensitive time. Before scattering ashes, please seek approval from the Council. There's no legal obligation for us to keep records, and there's no charge for using this facility.

For a personal touch, you can provide a memorial brass plaque (not exceeding 10cm x 12cm) with up to three lines of text. For residents' convenience, you can find Once approved, we'll securely affix the plague to the memorial wall on your behalf.

We've established regulations for the ashes scattering area in alignment with health and safety guidelines and advice from the Institute of Cemetery and Crematoria Management (ICCM):

- Scatter ashes during daylight hours.
- Burial of ashes isn't permitted.
- Ash scattering is only allowed when there's no snow on the ground.
- Please refrain from leaving additional

tributes, mementos, or trinkets, except approved memorial plagues.

Non-regulation items will respectfully removed. Memorial plagues will be maintained for 20 years before retirement.

In addition, we want to inform residents about an upcoming event. The Institute of Cemetery and Crematoria Management will hold a Cemetery Management and Memorial Headstone Inspection training day on April 25, 2024, in Sleaford Road cemetery.

the 2023 Cemetery Rules and Regulations adopted by Ruskington Parish Council on our website and the cemetery noticeboard.

Please remember that RPC has the authority to remove non-regulation items to ensure the cemetery remains respectful, tidy, and safe for all. Whenever possible, we'll contact the responsible person for grave/plot maintenance in advance.

Your understanding and cooperation are greatly appreciated as we endeavor to provide a peaceful and respectful resting place for your cherished loved ones.

RUSKINGTON YOUTH CENTRE

A Beacon of Community Alongside the Youth Clubs, the Centre hosts Support regular activities such as the YPLP, Beckside

In Ruskington, the Youth Centre stands as a vital hub of community activity. Last autumn, both the Ruskington Youth Club and the Rainbow Flyers Youth Club received recognition as Co-op Community Champions, resulting in an impressive fundraising total of £2820.

On 12 January, Rachel Fox, representing the Co-op, officially presented the funds to the Youth Centre Committee, stakeholders, volunteers, and club members. The Centre extends its gratitude to the Co-op and its customers for their support.

This year marks the Centre's 50th anniversary since its establishment as an LCC Youth Centre in 1974. Despite facing closure in 2015, the community rallied together to keep it operational as a non-profit limited company, with volunteers sustaining youth provision since then.

Alongside the Youth Clubs, the Centre hosts regular activities such as the YPLP, Beckside Knitting and Sewing Group, and the U3A crafting group. It has also provided temporary accommodation for The Ruskington Scouts, Cubs, and Beavers following the flooding of their Scout Hut.

With the recent funding, improvements to the Centre's exterior lighting are planned to enable year-round outdoor activities. Additionally, holiday activities will be expanded to benefit both club members and the wider youth community.




Grand Opening


