What is the LRF?

The Lincolnshire Resilience Forum (LRF) brings together emergency services, local authorities, health providers, the Environment Agency, voluntary groups, and other key organisations.



Your Community Needs You!

Community Emergency Response Team



It is a group of trained local volunteers, who are ready to act and support their community, by preparing for, responding to and recovering from emergencies.

These teams are vital for community resilience, when neighbours work together, they are stronger in an emergency.

Examples (not just flooding)

Wainfleet

Suspected viable firearm parts manufacturing within community

- 100m cordon is in place
- Homes evacuated
- Roads closed through town



Actions of Community Resilience

- Wainfleet Emergency Response Team.
- Coronation Hall used as a temporary place of safety.
- Primary School informed because of time and location to the cordon.
- Coronation Hall became to go to centre for up-to-date information for the community.

Flood Alerts & Warnings

Be prepared for flooding

Flood Alert

Flooding is possible – be prepared.



Flood Warning

Flooding is expected – act now.

Severe Flood Warning

Severe Flooding– danger to life.



Key Actions

Consider WHAT are the key actions your Community Emergency Response Team can do.

At Risk Areas/People

Consider WHO in your community could be at risk.

Consider WHERE might be more affected and WHY

Safe Places

WHERE are the potential safe places your community could go to in an emergency?

Available Resources

WHO makes up your Community Emergency Response Team, and what skills do they have?

WHAT equipment do you have available?

Potential Dangers

WHAT are the potential risks that could impact your community.

How Can You Help your Local CERT?

Which Role Is A Good Fit For Me?
I am good at/with...

...Leading people

You could make a good CERT Team Leader or Deputy Leader.

Be organised and coordinate the response and support the team.

... Paperwork

You could be the vital administrative support or log keeper.

Help track resources and write down all the important details.

...Talking to People

You could do the welcome and rest centre registration.

Be the first friendly face to reassure your community and make sure everyone gets checked in.

...Making a Cuppa

You could do the refreshments and washing up.

Keep the team fuelled and provide a comforting cuppa and snacks to keep spirits high.

...Social Media

You could help with warning and informing.

Share official information to avoid rumours and misinformation. Keep everyone informed.
